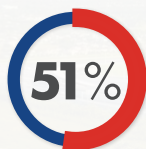

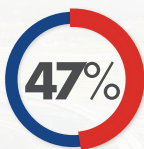
WHAT IS AGGRESSIVE DRIVING?

-  Speeding

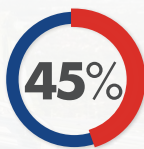
According to AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, millions of drivers engaged in the following aggressive behaviors including:



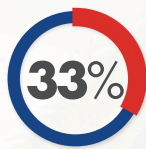
Purposely tailgating

- Use turn signals
- Allow others to merge
