- Sgt. Bolduc provided the City of Miami Beach Updates:
 - o Grant for next week (more hours – focus entire team on distracted driving awareness.
 - o Big push – micromobility – enforce e-bikes
 - o Ordinance about where devices can go – pending
 - o Hand-count tickets currently. Regulations (below)
 - o Micromobility Press release – pending

FSS Bike/Micromobility Regulations	Traffic Infraction \$77.50 Issued with Ethos (UTC)
316.2065 (2)	Ride other than upon or astride a permanent and regular seat (Riding on bicycle by standing on it)
316.2065 (3)(a)	More <u>persons</u> at one time than the number for which it is designed or equipped (Riding more than Bike/Micromobility is designed for)
316.2065 (3)(d)	Under 16 years of age must wear a bicycle helmet (No helmet)
316.2065 (4)	Attach himself or herself to any vehicle <u>upon</u> a roadway. (Riding by grabbing car)
316.2065 (5)(a)	Ride as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway unless the lane is marked as a shared lane. (Taking over the street)
316.2065 (6)(a)	Ride more than two abreast (No more than 2 bicycles/Micromobility, impeding traffic)
316.2065 (7)	Between sunset and sunrise; front exhibiting a white light, rear exhibiting a red light (Lights requirement)
CMB Bicycle Regulations	Traffic Infraction \$129.00 Issued with Ethos (UTC)
70-67 (a)	Bicycling between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m., in, on, or upon any portion of Lincoln Road Mall (Bicycling on LR)
70-67 (d)	Unlawful to operate, at any time, any motorized means of transportation, in, on, or upon any portion of the Beachwalk (Micromobility on Beachwalk)
70-67 (e)	Unlawful to operate, at any time, any motorized means of transportation, in, on, or upon any portion of the Sidewalk (Micromobility on Sidewalk)
70-69 (c)(1)	Such speed endangering pedestrian or others safety (Micromobility Too fast/Endangering)
70-69 (c)(2)	Obstruct or <u>endanger</u> pedestrian or vehicular traffic (Micromobility Blocking/Endangering)
70-69 (c)(3)	Yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian, and shall give an audible signal before overtaking (Micromobility Careless)

- o Ms. Castillo mentioned the City of Miami DUI Enforcement last week – dozens of citations
 - o DWLS – Driving While License Suspended (common)



District Six

- NVDL – No valid driver's license
 - DRE – Drug Recognition Expert - Police need to be certified
 - Note: Impairment other than DUI – a lot more verification required.
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- Sgt. Bolduc said he would possibly pick up materials the week of April 23
