- TPO Helmet giveaway held this week.
- Legislative update re micromobility: E-bike restrictions and group tasked with coming up with recommendations by October.
 - Micromobility PSA – pending due to legislative updates.
 - Ms. Sclafani mentioned how electric scooters and e-bikes are not following safety procedures. Will contact UM contact Ms. Cabrera.

 - <https://www.flsenate.gov/Session/Bill/2026/382> - less than 750 watts (not equal to) - Typical manufacturing is 750 watts – need to check
 - [Florida may slow e-bikes on sidewalks as safety concerns grow](#)
 - FDOT Central office provided effective July 1 – language updates – 2027
 - Language: Updates Florida's traffic laws to address electric bicycles, scooters, and motorcycles.
 - Defines “electric motorcycle” as: Any motorcycle powered by an electric motor of 750 watts or more that is capable of a speed greater than 28 miles per hour.
 - Requires a valid learner's driver license to operate or rent a Class 3 electric bicycle. Operator must keep license in their possession while operating.
 - Requires that e-bike operators give an audible signal before passing a pedestrian on a shared pathway not adjacent to a roadway, including pathways in recreational areas.
 - Melissa FHSMV – crash data reporting
 - Possible statewide micromobility committee
 - Ms. Leon said North Roosevelt – stopping traffic for pedestrians – presentations, discussions meetings to begin next month. Presentation heads-up during CTST meeting.
 - Monroe County update:
 - Ms. Castillo mentioned connecting Ivona Coleman, Community Health Improvement Manager, Florida Dept of Health Monroe County to UM safe rides to school to conduct bike safe rodeo.
 - Applied for TA grant with master pedestrian master plan. Presentation in January. Should know soon/probably before June.
 - Key West Update:
 - Mr. Stachurski provided UM contact – Elizabeth Cabrera-in chat
 - Working with UM Safe walk to Schools on upcoming Bike Rodeo



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- UM's focus is bike/ped - elementary and middle school
 - High visibility enforcement – north Roosevelt path.
 - SOS field day – parks 43 helmet fittings
 - 540 rechargeable lights, 140 bells
 - He invited the safety team to participate in the May 9 – bicycle rodeo – Key West. 10 –2 (details pending)
 - Key West adopted comprehensive safety grant – helps identify issues contributing to serious issues/fatalities - consider micromobility issues
