 - o Strategic Highway Safety Plan – June 2026

- UM Updates –
 - o Curriculum completion forms are forthcoming. Three curricula are currently at approximately 90 percent completion.
 - o Crash data sorter: Micromobility crash data is being reviewed using PD forms and reporting data. The analysis will identify the year of each crash, the victim's age, whether the victim was under 18, and the type of device involved. A running log will be maintained for legislative purposes, which may help comply with the new statute. Slides were shared; link to be provided from the UM team.
 - o Property: E-motos, or electric motorcycles, are considered off-road vehicles; however, they may not have VIN numbers.
 - o Simon Cowell accident: Mentioned as an example of a miscoded or misidentified detail in a crash report. FHP and other departments are creating their own lists for legislative tracking purposes.
 - o Since 2019, incidents appear to be split approximately 50 percent user error and 50 percent clear failure of infrastructure support. Common issues include unprotected left turns on green signals with pedestrian crosswalks on the left, driveway incidents, limited protected sidewalks, and hedges or fences blocking sight lines. In some cases, drivers overtake scooter riders while moving into driveways. Private lots may offer a middle-ground opportunity for bike infrastructure.
 - o UM Police Chief: Possible introduction (**Once further information is provided**)
