B. MDCPS Updates:

- FDOT Project at Lejeune/Altera issue occurred when the school zone markings showed that the area would be shorted by 300 feet. MDCPS requested information about the reduction as it would be unsafe for students. FDOT apparently did not approve of those markings, as that reduction is not in the project's plans. FDOT is looking into why/how this happened and will respond to MDCPS shortly.
- MDCPS is also looking at changing the way they approach safety presentations in the future – as they only had two last school year. They are looking at more than three presentations at high schools that are impacted and including possibly middle schools. Looking at schools located at construction areas.

C. UM Walk Safe/Bike Safe Updates: WalkSafe provided the year-end totals:

- 209 Schools Completed WS Elementary CCF (Only 8 missing in the county) with 79,668 students taught with 1062 teachers implementing.
- Elementary school totals below:
- 121 Schools Completed BS Elementary CCF, 37,015 students were taught about pedestrian and Bike safety
- Middle Schools Totals below:
- 103 Schools Completed BS Middle CCF (Only 2 missing) 27,781 students taught with around 177 teachers implementing.
- Reviewing feedback from newly developed curriculum
- Kurt with UM is working on signal road analytics – bike safety is trending up – focus on e-bikes, scooters and various other micromobility devices.

D. TPO Updates:

- Florida Bike Association has good materials (see bottom of agenda)



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- TPO mentioned how bike association is looking at patterns of accident locations in Coastal communities or around school campuses.
- Also interested in UM coding system of tracking accidents with various micromobility devices
- Working with vision zero – looking at 21 sites. Looking for school areas.
- Working with Pinecrest – promoting safety in the community - **Oct. 7 Palmetto Elem. Walk to school day.**
- Request: TPO would like to be part of the micromobility committee. Safer land use.
- Other areas where they are tracking near misses using AI include MB, Hialeah, NM, Downtown, SDade trail, and West Miami.
- Two more cities have adopted VZ action plans. **Palmetto Bay and South Miami.** Will update TZ map! link: [FDOT Target Zero Partner Map](#)
- Several cities requested letters of support – Opa-locka (partnered with Transit Miami & Tri-Rail– one of few cities with significant correlation along transit, Homestead and Dr. Robert B Ingram school.
- South Miami, NMB also applied – using county's action plan.
- Bay Harbor Islands – also requested letters of support.
- North Bay Village – providing helmets. 11-year-old helmet! 3-year expiration date!
- Participated in bike bus in Miami Springs (not enough staff for Sunny Isles)
- Announced the June 25 Safe Streets Cinema – James L. Knight Center – providing helmets, World Cup, expecting traffic congestion.
- Florida APA – TPO presentations including Bike Bus in collaboration with Bike Safe

- Will be presenting at the Safe Streets cinema event
- US DOT – grant manager – SS4A – will be here for event.
- 160 street study included disability component
- Bike website has been finalized

- Kick-off City of Hialeah tomorrow – funded through congressional support
- Peer exchange yesterday – presentation by Hialeah trail (follows Metrorail to transfer station to Hialeah station), Underline, 79 Street Line, Ludlam Trail, SE Overtown.

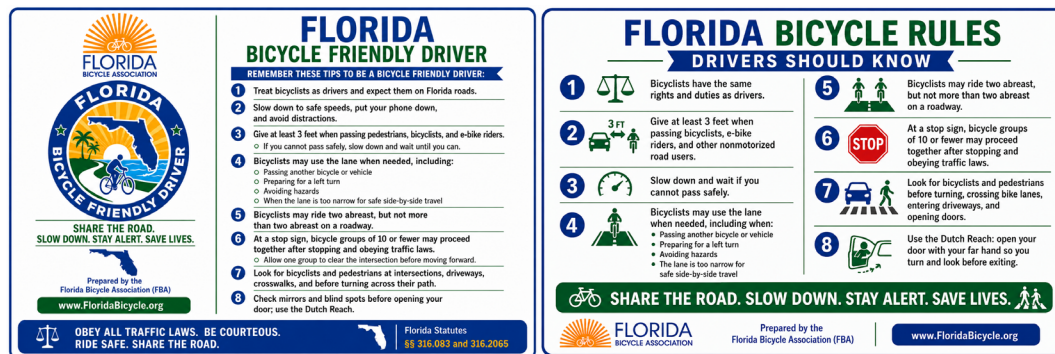
