- "AAA Safer Together: The Next Chapter" held at District Six – to be held **December 8** featuring Safe System Approach – connecting the dots between the public agencies. Evite coming soon.
- Legislative update – Senate bill 382 – Governor vetoed bill [CS/SB 382](#)
The Governor has a vetoed bill. Micromobility device enforcement still can be handled by municipalities.
 - Difficult to maneuver
 - Enforcement difficult to manage
 - Reservations about task force sunset date
- Key West and Monroe County are discussing what to do next re SB 382.
 - Meeting tomorrow and another meeting later in August to discuss micromobility with commission group. Monroe County is taking a lead in the usage of technology for data collection.
 - SS4A tech tracks different vehicles – not yet finalized. May be first City in state – collecting speed data.
 - Framework to be created for other cities to adopt, so all have the same approach. This fiscal year once approved. UF is the lead.
- FDOT suggested Key West join Bike & Ped State Coalition.
- Tips on taking Brightline from Miami to Orlando to attend. Organizers are provided per diem.



- FDOT provided updates on Miami-Dade cities who currently have ordinances.
 - Restrictions on where e-bikes can travel.
- Jackson currently tracks level 2 trauma center – coded by ECODE (diagnosis code)– classified for scooters, e-bikes. Data can be pulled if anyone is requested. Weekly/daily device injuries.
 - Met with other hospitals in Monroe County – under and over triaging
 - Fall prevention tips provided to ALFs and to stop the bleed education as well
 - Currently works with Survive the Ride Program – motorcycle safety – weekly reports
 - Requested info on outreach events to participate in.

Monroe County provided the following updates:

- Bike Helmet Program in Monroe County - 31 helmets provided at Big Pine Key and other events
 - Hoping to get more regional trainers. Looking for partnerships to fit more helmets in Monroe
 - Requirement to fit a couple hundred before becoming regional trainer
 - Talktify.com - flyers and upcoming event – free
 - Key West requested more helmets – fiscal year begins in October which is when they can put in request
 - FDOT central Office to launch specific webpage/site for ordering materials/helmets to partners across the state.
 - Quarterly SS4A meeting – Broward MPO is organizer – virtual meeting
